



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

#### LET'S DO LUNCH.

In 2019, I would like to sit around the table with each member household to get to know you, your family, and your hopes for our congregation's journey together. To facilitate this, LET'S DO LUNCH. (Or breakfast, or dinner.) The idea is that I would join you at home – or, if you would rather, in a local dining establishment – for one hour over a meal. By the end of the year, I hope to visit all households. While I know many of you at this point, there are other members I still don't know as well as I'd like. Please help me fix that.

Rather than attempt the herculean task of managing a sign-up sheet and matching it with my ever-changing schedule, I'm asking that each member household would fill out a visit card, indicating your preference of breakfast, lunch, or dinner, and checking which days normally work best for you. The office will then contact you with three time/date suggestions. If one works, approve it. If not, we'll give three more until one does. Cards are available at church on the glass case or from the office.

### NATURAL CHURCH DEVELOPMENT

Natural Church Development (NCD) is a study our church is undertaking, as we come to the close of this decade, to position ourselves for growth in 2020 and beyond. It's based on five principles:

First: NCD focuses on increasing the quality of a church rather than on numerical growth goals. This emphasis on **church health** has proven to be the key to ongoing growth and multiplication.

Second: The center of NCD is the **all by itself** principle that can be observed in healthy churches around the globe. All NCD principles are answers to the question: "How can this God-given growth potential be released?"

Third: On all levels of church life, NCD encourages creativity, authenticity, and **diversity**. Rather than selling a specific church model, NCD helps Christians and churches to discover and develop their individuality.

Fourth: NCD assists believers in rediscovering central **Biblical** concepts and relating them to their everyday lives. This is expressed by the Trinitarian Compass which is the heart of all NCD tools.

Fifth: **It works.** Churches that have done three or more NCD Surveys have increased their average growth rate by 51% between the first and the third survey. We plant, we water. God gives the increase.

This is just an introduction. You'll be seeing and hearing more about NCD this month!

### **Greed or Trust**

An under-appreciated aspect of the Christian faith is that it encourages people to move away from a self-indulgent appetite of tight-fistedness to conviction that carries a responsibility for the needs of others.

Greed however, thrives within all humans. The desire to have more, driven by an insatiable longing is one of the prevalent motivators in our culture. For proof, simply watch the lottery purchases from week to week.

Just like sin in general most people, even Christians, are not fully aware of how greed lives within, nor how it affects our thinking and decision making. If you ask most participants who partake in the lottery, they will tell you that it's 'just entertainment.' Greed casts a longing passion for what we don't have.

God thought it was important enough to focus two of the ten commandments specifically on this Greed tendency. Other commandments dealing with stealing, killing or adultery have their origins in greed.

Martin Luther used the word 'trust' often in his instructional catechisms. He states in the explanations of the commandments, "we should fear, love and TRUST in God so that . . . (we live according to His Will)."

Trust is the response of faith, believing in what we have not seen. Trust gives hope and increases reliance on the object of our trust.

When people number their days, they will typically have one of two reactions. Either they will avoid the thought of death, longing for more and more enjoyment of this life, or they will rely on the promise of this life turning to immortality.

Less than half of Americans prepare their estate plan before their death. We encourage people who know and trust in God, to move forward with confidence that our future is under God's protection. He cares for us and promises to give all good things for our well-being. Trust today!

# PENNY WAR 2019 "FogQuest"



### \* 1800 CHILDREN UNDER 5 YEARS OF AGE DIE EACH DAY FROM A WATER RELATED ILLNESS \*

FogQuest is a not-for-profit, registered charity working in third world countries, erecting specially designed nets that collect clean water from fog. Their nets condense the water droplets found in fog, producing a minimum of 50 gallons of water each day, enough to supply about 10 people with clean water daily. Each net costs about \$1000 and lasts approximately 10 years. The water produced meets World Health Organization standards for safety.

FogQuest works in rural areas where weather conditions are appropriate for their equipment, and populations are low enough that it's not feasible for larger organizations to provide traditional wells or other means for obtaining clean water.

### \* THERE ARE NO PAID EMPLOYEES AT FOGQUEST \*

FogQuest is an all-volunteer organization. Donations to FogQuest are used to pay for the nets and equipment and the travel expenses of their volunteer leaders. Most volunteers who assist with the building projects pay their own travel costs.

HOW YOU CAN HELP: Our Penny War will be held during Lent, beginning on March 10 and continuing until Palm Sunday on April 14. Our Sunday School students will compete in groups to see who can raise the most money for this mission project. You can help by making a donation to any of our students for their group's bank. There will also be a Penny War jar available on the glass case for anyone who would like to lighten their pockets or purses by donating their change. And you are welcome to donate using your March special mission envelopes.



LOOSE CHANGE SUNDAY will be held on March 24. On that Sunday, the congregation will be encouraged to "lose" their change (or a paper money donation) onto the pews after the service, and our Sunday School students will hunt for your donations.

#### YOU'RE INVITED TO OUR NEXT MEETING!

The next meeting of the Social Ministries committee will be held after worship on March 3. A light lunch will be provided. New members are always welcome! There are many in need in our world, and we have tough decisions to make—your help would be appreciated!

### <u>UPDATES</u>....

**THANK YOU** for your generous donations to our annual Giving Tree project. We were able to pack 30 large boxes and deliver them, along with several gift cards, at the beginning of January. The local agencies that distributed your gifts included the Magdalene Project, Summit Life Resources, Niagara Gospel Rescue Mission, and Heart, Love, and Soul Food Pantry. Thank you to volunteers Alice Moll, John & Sue Loss, Pastor Brese, and Jane & Russ Hughes for making the deliveries to these agencies. Many of our neighbors in need were helped by your loving donations.

**TURKEYS & HAMS** - A total of 5 hams and 21 turkeys were donated this year. They were welcomed by the Community Mission and the organizers of the Lord's Day Dinner as they served the homeless on both Thanksgiving and Christmas Day.

**NOVEMBER SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPE DONATIONS** totaled \$286. With additional funds from the Social Ministries budget and matching funds from Thrivent Financial, we were able to send \$1372 to LCMS Disaster Relief as they continue to assist the victims of the multiple natural disasters experienced around our country at the end of 2018.

**DECEMBER MISSION ENVELOPES** received \$424 in donations, and with additional designated funds from the Social Ministries budget, we were able to send \$824 to Niagara Falls Meals on Wheels. This small organization in our inner-city functions with four minimum wage employees and a few dedicated volunteers to meet the nutritional needs of those who would otherwise fall through the cracks because they are unable to provide for their own meals, but do not qualify for government assistance. Thank you for your generous donations.

#### **ONGOING MINISTRIES**

**Lap Robes and Shawls**: Grace has a dedicated group of ladies who knit and crochet lap robes for Hospice and shawls for various nursing homes. To date, they have donated over 200 blankets to Hospice and numerous shawls. If you are looking for something to do with your knitting or crocheting skills, please talk to Jane Hughes. They would be happy to have your help.

**Card Ministry**: If you are aware of someone who could be cheered with a greeting card for a special need or a special occasion, please let Trish Andrews know by speaking with her or dropping a note in her mailbox. We are glad to send a card to anyone who could benefit from this ministry.

**Old Eyeglasses and Hearing Aids** can be donated to the collection box located on the glass case. These are given to the Lion's Club, which refurbishes them and distributes them in the United States and around the world to individuals that would not otherwise be able to see or hear.

**Toiletry Samples** that you may receive in the mail or from hotel visits can be placed in the collection box on the glass case. These are distributed by the Magdalene Project in Niagara Falls as they work with women in our city who are living on the streets and often resort to prostitution as a means of support. The Magdalene Project works to reassure them of the love Jesus has for them and helps them to rebuild their self-esteem as they plan new paths for their lives.

### **LOOKING FORWARD....**

**FEBRUARY MISSION ENVELOPES** will be designated to support Rev. Duane Meissner, a Lutheran pastor serving as a long-term missionary in Belize (a Central American country on the southern border of Mexico). Pastor Meissner is a former vicar of Pastor Bahr. When he began his missionary work in Belize, there were no Lutheran churches in the country. He has established one congregation and is now working to establish a second. He and his wife have four young children, three of which are adopted. There is much work left to do in Belize, since most still follow a religion loosely based in Catholicism, but including the worship of deceased ancestors and the frequent sacrifice of animals. We will be hearing more about this mission from Pastor Bahr during February.

**MARCH MISSION ENVELOPES** are designated to help support our annual Penny War. This year we will be raising money for an organization called "FogQuest", which works in third world countries erecting specially designed nets to collect clean, usable water from fog. Additional information about our Penny War is found elsewhere in this Gleanings. Please check it out.

**TOILET TISSUE MISSION:** Sister Beth from Heart, Love, and Soul Food Pantry in Niagara Falls has shared with us that they have come to look forward to this annual project. Throughout the month of February, we will be accepting toilet tissue donations which can be left on the table in the narthex or chapel. As we all know, this is an item that is used every day—and yet it cannot be purchased with benefit cards. Your gifts will help our neighbors maintain their dignity as they deal with the many challenges they face.

YOUNG LIFE'S ANNUAL FUNDRAISING DINNER will be held on Thursday, March 28, at 6 PM at Classics V. The dinner is free. If you wish to support Young Life, donations will be accepted during this event. Young Life is a national organization (with local chapters) whose volunteers are concerned enough about kids to listen to their stories and build friendships. They help youth see that their lives have worth, meaning, and purpose. We have member youth that currently participate in Young Life activities and camps. Please feel free to talk with Dick Crawford if you have questions about this organization. It is time to sign up on the glass case if you plan to attend. Note—if you sign up to go and your plans change, PLEASE cross off your name or notify Dick Crawford. "No shows" create an extra expense for Young Life and take away from their fundraising efforts.
