Members, friends, and family of Grace,

In this issue of The Gleanings, I'd like to let you know about two events coming up for our Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, the national church body of which Grace and I are members. The first event, held from July 11-15, is the LCMS Youth Gathering; and the second, from July 20-25, is the 67th Convention of the LCMS. Both are triennial events (occur every three years).

In Minneapolis this July, about 25,000 youth age 14-19 – plus leaders, volunteers, and staff - will continue a tradition begun in 1980 of youth from around our entire church body gathering together for a week of fun, worship, fellowship, service, study, entertainment, exhibitors, growing in faith, and an all-around good time. These young people will hear and experience the love of Jesus in a personal way, while simultaneously being strengthened by the realization that they are not alone in their faith. For youth who are used to groups of perhaps less than ten, hearing 25,000 voices their age singing praises to God and celebrating Communion together is indescribably inspiring.

I've been selected as a "Community Life Builder" - 200 volunteer adults who staff the event, also known as the "Yellow Shirts" due to their distinctive Tshirts. I'm one of three CLBs from the Eastern District, and this will be the second Gathering I've attended (and the first as a staff member).

The 67th Regular Convention of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, JOY:FULLY LUTHERAN, will be held in Tampa, FL July 20-25. The Convention, made up of one pastoral delegate and one lay delegate from each Circuit of our Synod, is our primary decision-making body - kind of like a national Voters' Assembly. The LCMS is an advisory body and does not have direct control over our congregation, yet the Convention sets the parameters under which we agree to walk together. Key decisions this year will likely include the relationship of laity and clergy (especially regarding the service of Deacons), the authority of the Synod President, and much more.



Last year, I was elected by our circuit as an alternate (substitute) delegate. Since then, our circuit's elected voting delegate has resigned from the clergy roster. As next in line, I will therefore be representing our Niagara West congregations in Tampa. Please keep both the Convention and the Youth Gathering in your prayers, as well as my safe travel (and sanity!) for each event.


PRE-TEEN MINISTRY

Grade 3-5 met on Saturday, May 18th for the kick-off event of the new pre-teen ministry. There was plenty of laughter and energy as the young youths played, learned and ate together.

This event's topic was Beginnings (Part 1): Genesis 1-2. With the assistance of a \$250.00 Thrivent Action Team Grant, six of our Grace members along with one other served lunch on Saturday, April 6th, 2019 at the Magdalene Project in Niagara Falls, New York.

The funds enabled our group to purchase, prepare, and serve a healthy and delicious meal to more than fifty men, women, and children. Each of us had different tasks ranging from making sloppy joe, a fresh tossed salad, fresh fruit salad, two homemade cakes, and a large punch bowl filled with Hawaiian punch, 7UP, ice cream, sherbet, and pineapple. In addition, we had green beans, tortilla and potato chips, and candy treats that filled out our menu for all who attended. Our efforts certainly personified the team concept here.

We as a group had the opportunity to interact with the lunch recipients who thoroughly enjoyed our efforts. Many told us "Thank You" and quite a few came back for seconds along with some taking home a box lunch.

Each table had a nice Alice-Moll-made 5 x 7 picture frame featuring one of our church bulletins. Some of the diners liked them so much they asked if they could have them and we said sure.

This was a time for Grace members to share their time and talents and to feel the joy that their efforts provided to individuals who look for others for their daily food needs. To help someone in need knowing at this time you have made a difference is doing God's commandment of "Love Thy Neighbor".

APRIL SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPES: Donations to April Special Mission envelopes for Orphan Grain Train were matched by our Social Ministries budget and by Thrivent, enabling us to send a check in the amount of \$1200 to Orphan Grain Train's work in Nebraska as they continue to aid in the recovery from severe wind damage and massive flooding associated with the March winter hurricane. DONATION OPPORTUNITIES...

SUMMIT BABY BOTTLE BANK FUNDRAISER: Baby bottle banks will continue to be available in the chapel and narthex until Father's Day (6/16) for those who would like to support Summit's annual fundraiser. We are also accepting donations of diapers (size 1, 2, or 3), and baby toiletries. Summit is located on Pine Avenue near the City Market, and works with teens and young women experiencing unplanned and crisis pregnancy situations, offering counseling, parenting, and childcare classes. They maintain a boutique of necessary baby items. Shopping in the boutique is done with tokens earned each time a client attends a counseling or class session. If you have questions about Summit, feel free to speak with Alice Moll.

SUMMER MISSION PROJECT: Beginning in July and continuing until Rally Day on September 8th, we will have tables available in the chapel and narthex to accept donations of school supplies, socks, and underwear. All gifts donated will be distributed to inner city school children in Niagara Falls by the administrators, school nurses, and teachers. Partnering directly with the schools allows us to ensure that your gifts are placed directly into the hands of the children that are most in need. Jane Brese delivers our donations each year, and would be happy to discuss their needs with you if you have questions.

SOMETHING DIFFERENT: While we continue to be thankful for individual donations of school supplies, this year we will also have school supply lists from Harry Abate Elementary School as soon as they are available for those who might wish to adopt a "virtual student". If you would like to participate in this way, you can pick up a supply list from the donation tables for your preferred grade, purchase everything on the list, and bring the items back to the table in a paper bag (or book bag) with the supply list attached to the outside. These bags will be delivered to Harry Abate in September and the teachers will distribute them as appropriate.

RECYCLING OPPORTUNITY—There is a box available for you to drop off laser toner cartridges and inkjet cartridges from your home and work computer printers for recycling. We are helping the environment as well as earning cash back for certain items. Just drop your cartridge in the box, and we'll do the rest. If you have questions, please contact Virginia Markel.

DONATION OPPORTUNITIES...

"CELL PHONES FOR SOLDIERS": We are now accepting old cell phones for recycling with this organization. All styles of working and broken phones are accepted along with chargers if available. "Cell Phones for Soldiers" sends newer models to deployed soldiers. Older or broken models are recycled by them for cash to provide minutes. You may remove the SIM card or use the "factory reset" option to erase all personal information prior to donating your phone if desired. However, "Cell Phones for Soldiers" follows Department of Defense standards for wiping personal information from phones they receive. Virginia Markel is the contact person for this project.

5 x 7 FRAMES NEEDED: Our extra bulletins are being framed and used by the Magdalene Project and Niagara Gospel Rescue Mission as inspirational gifts to their clients. This is an ongoing project that requires 5 x 7 frames. If you have gently used frames of this size to donate, they can be left in the donation center at any time. Alice Moll will be happy to answer any questions you may have regarding this mission.

OLD EYEGLASSES AND HEARING AIDS can be donated to the collection box located in the donation center. These are given to the Lion's Club, which refurbishes them and distributes them in the United States and around the world to individuals that would not otherwise be able to see or hear. Ross Folmsbee is the contact person if you have questions.

NEW OPPORTUNITY: We are beginning a new project for the women served by the local agencies we partner with, such as the Magdalene Project. We will be donating gently used purses containing items such as travel size shampoo, soap, toothpaste/brushes, deodorant, combs, feminine hygiene products, etc. To make this project a success, we need donations of gently used purses. We also need donations of toiletry samples you may receive in the mail or during hotel visits, or that can be found in the travel section of department stores. There will be a donation box available.

Each year our Penny War allows us the opportunity to teach our Sunday School students about missions. And each year we discuss what it means to be a soldier in God's Army, as we read in Ephesians 6 about putting on the armor of God: "Put on the armor that God gives you, so that you will be able to stand up against the Devil's evil tricks. For we are not fighting against human beings but against the wicked spiritual forces in the heavenly world...So stand ready with righteousness as your breastplate...faith as a shield...accept salvation as a helmet...the word of God as the sword."
