Members, friends, and family of Grace,

The long-awaited time is here! This month, I am finally being sent by the military to Officer Training School, something that was supposed to be completed within one year of commissioning. (It's now been more than two, if you're counting.) Officer Training School (OTS) is basic training, complete with marching, pushups, and people in strange hats who seem to have gotten up on the wrong side of the bed that morning.

At some point soon after OTS, they will schedule me for Chaplain School, which is much more civilized and will specifically train me how to be an effective chaplain. Both of these schools are held in the same place: Maxwell Air Force Base, Montgomery, Alabama.

During OTS, I will unfortunately be almost completely out of contact. If you have pastoral needs during that time, call the office or one of our Elders. They have a list of local pastors who have agreed to cover visitations and emergencies. Intentionally, for security reasons, I can't give specific dates in public documents like this. However, dates will be announced in church.

While I'm gone, I've arranged a few great pastors to come in and cover services and Bible studies at Grace. Our guest preachers will include Rev. Alex Knowles (director of Camp Pioneer and himself a former military chaplain) and Rev. Dr. Chris Wicher (Eastern District President). We also plan a service to be led by the youth of our congregation! Our Wednesday Bible studies will be led by Rev. Ken Craig, former pastor of Immanuel-Lockport, who most recently has been working with St. Matthew in North Tonawanda. Rev. Denton White, pastor of our neighbor congregation of Holy Ghost, is first on the list for emergency pastoral care.

Due to the lack of available pastors in our area, we do have two Sundays which will be led by elders. I appreciate you supporting these gentlemen as they step outside their comfort zone to ensure you have the opportunity to worship. These two Sundays both happen to be Holy Communion Sundays. After careful evaluation of all the options and consultation with President Wicher, we will offer Communion according to our normal schedule, to avoid a lengthy interruption. How it works is like this: Prior to my departure, I will set apart and consecrate the bread & wine to be used for that day's worship service. In effect, I will be opening the feast. Then, under my administration of the meal as your called Pastor, the Elders will lead worship, repeating the Words of Institution not as a new consecration but for your sake, so that you can be assured this is Christ's own meal. They will then distribute Communion to you. This same process is regularly done when Elders make homebound visits. I want you to know that I approve this plan, as does President Wicher. If you recall your Small Catechism, it is God's Word in combination with eating & drinking the bread and wine which gives us the Eucharist. In Augsburg Confession article VIII, the church fathers state, "Both the Sacraments and Word are effectual by reason of the institution and commandment of Christ, notwithstanding they be administered by evil men." Now, I do not call our elders evil men! But the point is clear. Holy Communion comes from Christ's Word, regardless of the person up front. My administration of the meal and delegating the distribution to the Elders is in harmony with Augsburg XIII, just as is the preaching. If you have any questions or concerns about this, please call me.

God's blessings now and always be with you!



Youth for Truth is selling candy bars throughout the month of October to raise funds for the Jr./Sr. High retreat in November. Find a youth after service to get your candy bars!



#### **DONATION OPPORTUNITIES...**

HARVEST FOR FOOD COLLECTION: Our annual fall project will begin on Sunday, October 13, (Columbus Day weekend) and continue until Thanksgiving. Tables will be available in the chapel and narthex to receive donations of non-perishable canned and boxed foods. All donations are appreciated. Especially needed are peanut butter, jelly, tuna, cereal, pasta, spaghetti sauce, applesauce, and canned fruit. As in previous years, we are working with St. Vincent DePaul Society on Military Road (next to St. Leo's church). They have already been in contact with us to express their need and their appreciation for our help each year. They will distribute your gifts locally over the upcoming holiday season.

HAMS & FROZEN TURKEYS are also needed to help provide holiday meals for local families that have difficulty providing for themselves. These will be donated to the Community Mission and the Lord's Day Dinners in Niagara Falls. Watch for the sales that will begin soon. Donations can be stored in our downstairs kitchen freezer. If you need help carrying your donation, please ask an usher for assistance.

**REMINDER:** We are still accepting donations of 5 x 7 frames in our donation center. Our extra bulletins are placed in these frames and they are given to clients of several area agencies, including Magdalene Project, Summit Life Resources, and Niagara Gospel Rescue Mission. Jane reported that everyone at the school who saw her with the supplies made a special effort to express their appreciation, including the Superintendent of Niagara Falls Schools who just happened to be visiting on the day the delivery was made. Thank you also to Marla Crawford for obtaining a Thrivent Action Team grant and using it to shop for some additional items that she knows, as a teacher, are always in short supply.

PURSES FOR MAGDALENE: We are thankful for your donations of gently used purses and toiletry items, and for all of the work done so far by Robin Stephenson to pack and deliver 46 purses to the Magdalene Project. #### **SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPES...**

AUGUST SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPE donations totaled \$129. With funds added from our Social Ministries' budget, we were able to donate \$450 to the Lutheran Center for Religious Liberty, a group working with our government leaders to encourage and promote the continuation of religious freedoms in our country.

**OCTOBER SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPE: Lutheran** School make a difference in the life of a child, especially in today's world where Christian beliefs are rapidly losing acceptance, and behaviors that are clearly contrary to God's Word are now celebrated and encouraged. ADVENT GIVING TREE: Many agencies in our community will be in need of our help following the holiday season, when donations typically are at their lowest. We will provide Giving Trees in the chapel and narthex beginning December 1 and continuing through January 5. All donations will be delivered in the beginning of January to help the agencies we work with restock after the holidays. If you wish to participate in this project, please take a tag from the trees and bring the requested item (unwrapped) back to the table as soon as you are able.

#### **REFORMING OUR WAYS**

John the Baptist differentiated himself from Jesus by saying "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire." John's purpose was to make straight the paths and encourage us to "Bear fruits in keeping with repentance." (Luke 3:8) Similarly, St. Paul proclaimed that "God wants us to turn to God and perform deeds in keeping with our repentance." (Acts 26:20) Reforming our ways is not about outward alterations or a political viewpoint. Indeed, "God has granted repentance that leads to life!" (Acts 11:18)

In his famous 95 theses, Martin Luther wrote "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent' (Mt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Repentance is not simply a recognition of wrong-doing but being set free from sin itself. Repentance is acknowledging that all we can find about ourselves is sin, and that our rescue comes from Jesus who alone could rescue us through His life, death and resurrection. The reformers discovered the Jubilee of forgiveness, and it caught fire.

Many in our times equate God's kindness with prosperity, good looks, health or strong ability. However, if our ways aren't reformed in the heart, where sin emulates, then it's not likely to be a reformation that leads to Jubilee or eternal life. Paul asked the Romans, "Do you not know that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?" (Romans 2:4b).

Is repentance reforming your ways? When our ways are reformed by the Holy Spirit, we recognize our spiritual depravity before God. In the freedom of God's grace received, we notice the things we manage are not ours to manipulate for our dark purposes, but are opportunities given by God so that we might show His Son Jesus through our lives. The way we plan to distribute the worldly wealth we manage for Him will characterize blessings rather than curses.
