I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be soberminded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry. (2 Timothy 4:1-5)

Members, friends, and family of Grace,

We live in a time of abounding opinions shared without research or hesitation, of fact-checkers that need to be fact-checked, of companies striving to outdo each other in being the most "woke". Certain positions are popular, while daring to speak the opposite position may get one cancelled – or worse. Supposedly neutral companies do not hesitate to block access to opinions they do not share.

The church, bound to the Word of God, frequently finds herself at odds with culture's declaration of right and wrong. When that happens, we have two choices: conform to the view promoted by society (including but not limited to media, social media, universities, government schools, friends, family, employers, clubs, movies & tv, sports personalities, and many more – intense pressure indeed!), or we can hold to God's Word, and bear the consequences, which likewise may be many. In Finland, the Bishop of our sister Lutheran church there is being brought up on charges of incitement, facing imprisonment, for the crime of teaching that marriage is between a man and a woman. "As a Christian, I do not want to and cannot discriminate against or despise anyone created by God," Dean Pohjola said in reaction to being charged. "Every human being, created by God and redeemed by Christ, is equally precious." At the same time, he continued, "this does not remove the fact that, according to the Bible and the Christian conception of man, homosexual relations are against the will of God, and marriage is intended only between a man and a woman. This is what the Christian church has always taught and will always teach." Increasing voices in the United States call for the same criminalization of speech and thought they consider to be hate.

Are you ready in season and out of season? Do you know sound teaching when you hear it? Have you an ear for the Word of God alone, or are you following your own passions and wandering off into myths?

This is why, since the beginning, the Christian Church has gathered around Word and Sacrament for strength, encouragement, and the fellowship of believers. "They [the very first Christians] devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42). Choosing to neglect this most important gathering is like intentionally taking off the armor of God right before the battle. It leaves you vulnerable to false teachers and poor theology.

Please, come to Bible study. Please, come to worship. You need it, and we aren't the same without you.

SUMMER MISSION PROJECT (July through Labor Day)

OVER 75% OF THE FAMILIES at our inner city schools are living at or below the poverty level. Each year we partner with the teachers and nurses at our inner city schools to help meet the needs of these children for school supplies, socks, and underwear. Partnering in this way ensures that your gifts are placed directly into the hands of the children that are most in need.

NEW THIS YEAR: Beginning in September, our three inner city schools will become "sister schools", with Pre-K through 2nd grade students attending Kalfas and Niagara Street schools, and 3rd through 6th grades at Harry Abate. Through this sister school arrangement, services and supplies will be shared among all three schools as the need arises. That means that your donations to our summer mission project will reach children at **ALL THREE SCHOOLS!**

Tables will be available in the chapel and narthex beginning in July to receive your donations of **SCHOOL SUPPLIES**, **SOCKS**, & **UNDERWEAR**. Each year when we make our delivery, school officials reinforce to us that many of their students start their school year without proper clothing and supplies. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.

WHY SOCKS & UNDERWEAR? Nationally, socks and underwear are the items most often requested by individuals and families living in poverty. And, unfortunately, they are also the items least often gifted to donation centers. They are pieces of clothing most of us take for granted. But to families that are struggling to pay their rent and put food on the table, they are considered luxuries that can be moved from their "need" column to their "want" column. The reality is that shirts, pants, and shoes are required to send their children to school--underwear and socks are not. Your donations of socks and underwear will help provide both dignity and warmth during the upcoming school year.

THANK YOU to Social Ministries committee member Marla Crawford, a Grace member and teacher at Holy Ghost Lutheran School, for applying for a grant from Thrivent that will be used to supplement our donations. **THANK YOU** also to Jane Brese for faithfully delivering our gifts each year.

STOCK THE SHOPPE PROJECT

Continuing through Father's Day in June, we are accepting donations of new baby clothes, diapers, and baby toiletries for **SUMMIT LIFE OUTREACH CENTER.** Summit is a Christian organization located on Pine Avenue (near the Niagara Falls City Market) that is devoted to helping young women who find themselves in unplanned pregnancy situations. Their clients receive free counseling as well as pregnancy and parenting education. Their "earn while you learn" program awards credits for attendance at counseling and educational sessions, and the credits can be used to "purchase" needed baby supplies in their "Parenting Shoppe". Your donations will help to stock the Parenting Shoppe.

THANK YOU to Wendy Coleman & Jane Schulz for setting up our donation tables and to Wendy for applying for a Thrivent grant that will supplement this project, and to Alice Moll (who has volunteered at Summit) for obtaining our baby bottle banks and making deliveries each year.

EMBRACING WOMEN IN CRISIS

BABY BOTTLE BANKS are also available on our Summit Life Outreach tables. Feel free to take a bank or two and fill them with your spare change. The money raised from this annual fundraiser will help to purchase supplies needed by the volunteers, counselors, and teachers at Summit as they provide needed information and support to women in crisis situations related to unplanned pregnancies. Many of their clients are struggling emotionally and financially, may be homeless or in danger of becoming homeless, or are living in unsafe or abusive situations. UPCOMING SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPES

JUNE SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPES will be designated to support **Camp Pioneer.** Concordia Lutheran Ministries has agreed to purchase the property in partnership with Friends of Pioneer, who will operate and manage the camp. Both groups are extensions of LCMS. This arrangement will allow a fresh start, completely debt free! This means that every dollar raised will go directly into the ministry of Pioneer to restore, expand, and enhance the facility and its many ministry opportunities. JULY SPECIAL MISSION ENVELOPES will support Niagara Hospice. Niagara Hospice works with patients facing end-of-life situations to provide comfort, dignity, and improved quality of life. Services are provided in the patient's home, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and hospitals. Located on Ontario Avenue in Niagara Falls, Heart, Love, & Soul offers a variety of services to our city's most needy, including breakfast and lunch in their dining room, a food pantry, health screenings, assistance with obtaining needed services, toiletry items that cannot be purchased with benefit cards, and various activities for at risk children and adults.
