

UPDATES

Our annual **TOILET TISSUE** project was successful again this year. Thanks to your generosity and a Thrivent Action Team grant, we were able to gift 825 rolls of toilet tissue to Heart, Love, & Soul for distribution to the clients they serve. Thank you for supporting this much appreciated project that provides comfort and dignity to our neighbors in need. Thank you to Ross Folmsbee for organizing this project.

HOSPICE BOUQUETS: A total of 31 bouquets were placed on the altar on March 17, resulting in a \$310 donation to Niagara Hospice. Thanks to all who donated, Jane Schulz for organizing the orders, and to Jane and Wendy Coleman for arranging them on the altar.

MISSION ENVELOPE UPDATES:

JANUARY MISSION ENVELOPES were designated for Food for the Poor in memory of Rev. Daniel Otto, our past minister at Grace. We were able to send a donation of \$675 to help them provide clothing, food, shelter, and medical supplies throughout the United States and the world.

FEBRUARY MISSION ENVELOPES were designated for Young Life, an international youth organization with local chapters whose purpose is to bring teens to the knowledge of our loving Savior. We were able to contribute \$702 to support their work in our area.

UPCOMING MISSION ENVELOPES:

TO DONATE: If you would like to support our upcoming missions, please place your mission envelope in the offering plate during the designated month. You can also donate online at www.gracenf.org by clicking "give now" and choosing the "mission of the month" option.

APRIL MISSION ENVELOPES are designated to support **LUTHERAN BRAILLE WORKERS.** Approximately 7 million people are blind or have severe visual impairment. It would cost \$800 to purchase a Bible in English; \$2200 in Spanish. Typical large print Bibles are insufficient for those with eye disease such as macular degeneration.

Lutheran Braille Workers provides Braille and extra-large print Bibles, Luther's Catechism, devotions, and other Christian literature in English, Spanish, and multiple other languages **FOR FREE**. They are supported by the donations of individuals and churches.



These resources are assembled by volunteers who work production centers around the country. St. Mark NT and St. John NT are among the local churches looking to start a Large Print production center in North Tonawanda - one of only two in NY state!

MAY MISSION ENVELOPES are designated to support **Pioneer on the Lake** as they continue their outdoor ministry on Lake Erie in Angola. This summer, Pioneer will be offering retreats, family camps, a camp for music lovers, and camp opportunities for disabled individuals, as well as several special events. Cottages are available to rent for families or friend groups. Your donations will aid in the upkeep of the camp and programming plans.

SPRING MISSION PROJECTS

OISHEI CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL COMFORT BAGS: When children experience a condition that is serious enough to require admission to Oishei, they and their parents often experience a high level of anxiety. Many of these families have not had time to plan for a hospital stay, and their need for a pediatric specialty hospital may have taken them far from their homes.

Volunteers at Oishei pack and distribute Comfort Bags to all new admissions, ensuring that families feel warmly welcomed. The bags include toiletry items and a few toys or activities appropriate for the child's age to provide a measure of both care and comfort.

During April, we will accept donations of items that are needed to fill the Comfort Bags. Tables are available in the chapel and narthex to accept your gifts if you wish to participate. **There are "shopping lists" available** on each table with suggested items for your consideration.

Jim Wolf, one of our Elders, volunteers weekly with Oishei's Comfort Bag program, and he would be happy to answer any questions you may have about the bags or about volunteering opportunities at Oishei.

BABY ITEMS FOR SUMMIT LIFE CENTER: Summit, located on Pine Avenue in Niagara Falls, is run by volunteers who provide support to women in unplanned pregnancy situations. Summit's free services include pregnancy testing, sonograms, peer counseling, and a variety of classes pertaining to pregnancy and parenting. Each one-hour contact for counseling or classes results in earning credits that can be used in their Parenting Shoppe. From Mother's day (May 12) through Father's Day (June 16), we will accept donations to help "Stock the Shoppe". Items that are needed include infant clothing, blankets, diapers, and baby toiletries.

BABY BOTTLE BANKS: If you would prefer to support Summit with a cash or check donation, Baby Bottle Banks will be available on the donation tables for your use. Please turn your bottle banks in to the office or to Alice Moll.

CARE TEAMS ARE AVAILABLE:

Please let the office know if you become temporarily unable to attend worship due to illness, injury, or any other situation. If desired, you will be placed on the prayer list. We also have Care Teams that can arrange a visit and offer communion if requested. The teams consist of an Elder and a Social Ministries member, using wine and bread that has been consecrated by one of our member ministers.

ONGOING MINISTRIES:

EYEGLASSES & HEARING AIDS: We collect these items for donation to the Lion's Club, which makes them available all over the world free of charge to individuals who otherwise could not afford to purchase them. A box is available in the coat room for your donations. Keep this in mind as you are doing your spring cleaning.

SAMPLE-SIZED TOILETRIES: If you receive sample-sized or travel-sized toiletry items in the mail, from vacations, or from doctors & dentists that you cannot use, please consider placing them in the donation box in the coat room. We donate these products to Niagara Falls agencies that use them to help the homeless that they serve.

GREETING CARDS: We send birthday greetings to our "over 90 club" members, our homebound, and members or friends of the congregation that are ill, grieving, or facing other challenges in their lives. If you know of someone who would benefit from a card, please let Trish Andrews or the church office know.

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are *his*: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership *to you*? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since *you* belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.
