WELCOMING PEOPLE TO GROW IN HOPE, LOVE, AND CERTAINTY THROUGH GOD'S WORD OF GRACE.

A few weeks ago, I announced that the 107th Attack Wing had asked me to serve full-time, and that the LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces had therefore issued a Divine Call to that service. After prayer and difficult deliberation, I concluded that the ministry to the Airmen of the 107th was where my service was needed the most at this time. I therefore accepted the Call and announced that I would need to leave full-time ministry at Grace. My final day as sole pastor of Grace was November 30.

However, due to the unique nature of this Call, my family and I are not leaving. While my role is different, for Lacey and the boys nothing changes. We continue to be members of Grace, and during the pastoral vacancy I will lead services as available, likely about twice a month. For other pastoral needs, please contact the church office and Erin will assist you with getting in touch with a pastor on call. For emergencies, the Board of Elders can help. They will also be able to provide further details of the vacancy and Call process.

In his second epistle, the Apostle Peter speaks of the end times and the fear and destruction accompanying it. "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be...?" -2 Peter 3:10-11

One might expect a variety of answers, and certainly the world has its own opinions, most involving panic, conspiracy, or "doomsday" scenarios. But Peter's answer is quite straightforward. He recommends reading Paul's epistles and living by them. He tells his beloved people to be at peace and live lives of holiness. He reminds them that there are better things in store, even the "home of righteousness." And Peter concludes by saying: "There are some things in [Paul's letters] that are hard to understand, which the ignorant and unstable twist to their own destruction, as they do the other Scriptures. You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, take care that you are not carried away with the error of lawless people and lose your own stability. But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen."

A pastoral transition, though imparting some uncertainty, by no means rises to level of the end of days. Yet, Peter's words of peace may help the people of Grace as well. Make use of the gifts of God. Commit to weekly worship and Bible study. Generously support the work of the Lord at Grace, for He has many plans for you!

To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity.

Christmas Day worship will begin at 10:30 AM. Services will be conducted by our Board of Elders with Pastor Bahr volunteering his assistance at several of the upcoming services.

BIBLE CLASS & SUNDAY SCHOOL:

Bible Class and Sunday School will continue to be held on Sundays at 9 AM. Bible Class will be led by the Elders. Wednesday morning Bible Class is on a temporary pause as the Elders look for a volunteer (or volunteers) to lead the class. If you are interested in helping with this, please let Mark Andrews know.

There will **NOT** be Bible Class or Sunday School on Christmas morning.

CARE TEAMS:

The Board of Elders and Board of Social Ministries have teamed up to provide visits and communion to our homebound and ill members on a regular basis. Visits will begin in December. If you desire a home visit and have not been contacted by mid-December, please let the office know. If you become temporarily unable to attend church services due to an illness, injury, or any other situation, you are encouraged to contact the office so you can be placed on the prayer list and receive a home visit if desired. Please keep us informed of any needs that arise during our vacancy.

UPDATES

THANK YOU to all who volunteered at this year's Trunk or Treat, sponsored jointly by the Board of Education and Board of Social Ministries. It was the most successful we've had so far! We had 17 cars and a NFFD truck in our parking lot, along with games, free Bibles, free gifts, free T-shirts, drinks, and snacks. Over 170 member and neighborhood children visited along with their parents and grandparents, and there was an abundance of smiles and "thank you's". We gave away 10 Bibles this year. One family shared how much they appreciate the Bible we gave them last year and said it is used in their home on a daily basis. Praise the Lord! No matter how you helped...praying for our event, planning, advertising, donating snacks, bringing your car, helping with games and prizes, serving food, set up, clean up...it wouldn't have happened without your help! Thank you for helping to provide a safe, family-friendly event at our church!

AUGUST MONTHLY MISSION was designated for Lighthouse Women & Children's Center in Niagara Falls. We were able to send a check in the amount of \$900 to assist director Joanne Lorenzo as she works with the at-risk children and struggling, often homeless, women of Niagara Falls. Thank you for your generous donations.

DOOR OFFERING donations for Hurricane Ian disaster relief was matched at \$1 for every \$2 donated by Thrivent. Your generosity resulted in Lutheran Disaster Relief receiving a total of \$1080 for their work helping our neighbors in Christ as they recover from the devastation of the October storm.

All donations will be delivered in January to the appropriate agency.

ONGOING PROJECTS

CARD MINISTRY: If you are aware of someone who could be cheered with a greeting card for a special need or a special occasion, please let Trish Andrews know by speaking with her or dropping a note in her mailbox. We are glad to send a card to anyone who could benefit from this ministry.

OLD EYEGLASSES AND HEARING AIDS can be donated to the collection box located in the coat room by the parking lot door. These are given to the Lion's Club, which distributes them in the United States and around the world to individuals that would not otherwise be able to see or hear.

TOILETRY SAMPLES that you may receive in the mail or from hotel visits can be placed in the collection box in the coat room by the parking lot door. These are distributed by the Lighthouse Women & Children Center in Niagara Falls as they work with women in our city who are living on the streets and often resort to prostitution as a means of support. The Magdalene Project works to reassure them of the love Jesus has for them, and helps them to rebuild their self-esteem as they plan new paths for their lives.
