It was two years ago next month when we started "two weeks to flatten the curve", followed closely by "45 days to slow the spread." Just stay home, just social distance, just wear a mask, just get the vaccine, just move schools online, just get a booster, just don't visit people in nursing homes and hospitals, just wear a better mask, just get another booster, just... just... just. Now, almost 700 days later, mandates have yet to be withdrawn and the lines have become far more political than medical.

Our attendance is almost half what it was at this time in 2020, though some who are unable to join us in person do participate through YouTube. Programs and ministries have nearly ground to a halt and it's difficult to plan anything, not knowing when the next variant will appear or which child will sneeze and have to stay home from school this week, disrupting work schedules as well as family life.

One thing I've learned in the midst of all this is how much we need God's presence. It's so easy to become bitter, angry, depressed, upset, withdrawn, or rebellious. In doing so, we set aside the promises of God, focusing instead on the seemingly incontrovertible reality life places directly in front of us, with which we are bombarded every passing hour by the media, social media, friends, family, and our own thoughts.

God wants a better life for us, and He's right here to provide it.

When we pray in *Abide with Me*, "I need Thy presence every passing hour," what we're really praying is that **we** would open our eyes to see that in the midst of the storm, God is there. He always has been. Like Peter on the sea that day long ago, we see the wind and waves and we falter, but Jesus doesn't. He reaches out his hand and pulls us to the safety of his outstretched arms - the same arms that once stretched out on a cross, now embracing.

His presence is never-ending. His grace never-failing. And with Christ as our guide and stay, we can look into the future with confidence: When we are in His arms, no matter what may come, He will not let us go.

Please do **NOT** leave cell phones, ink jet cartridges, stamps, purses, or other items at this time since we have no outlet for them and it creates extra work for our volunteers.

UPCOMING PROJECTS & EVENTS:

FEBRUARY MISSION ENVELOPES are designated to support **YOUNG LIFE**, an international youth organization with local chapters whose purpose is to bring teens to the knowledge of our loving Savior through meetings, activities, camps, and mentorship from caring, Christian adults. We have several members that have participated in Young Life activities over the years. Dick Crawford has been associated with this organization for many years and would be happy to answer any questions you may have regarding their mission and local work.

MARCH MISSION ENVELOPES will be designated to support LCMS Disaster Response. They continue to help around the country at the various disasters that have been experienced over the past months. They are aiding the victims of September's hurricanes in the southern states. They had "boots on the ground" within 24 hours of the tornadoes that struck Kentucky and surrounding states and reported they were seeing the worst tornado damage they had ever encountered. LERT teams (Lutheran Emergency Response Teams) continue to deploy to areas needing help with clean up and rebuilding efforts.
