Happy New Year to our Grace Family and Worshippers,

As we begin our search for a new Pastor there are many ways to pray throughout the process

This is not an easy job. Pray that we would be unified and practice godly wisdom and discernment. Pray that the Lord would protect our Pastor Search Committee from unnecessary and unfair criticism from impatient church members.
- **3. Pray for your next Pastor.** While we may not know the identity of our next pastor, God does. And you can rest assured that the Lord can respond to any prayers uttered on behalf of our next pastor. As you pray for our next pastor, pray that God will give him the strength to leave his current ministry. Pray that God will give him a deep love for our church and community. Pray that the Lord will give him a strong desire to teach and preach the whole counsel of God and to fulfill the other biblical roles of a shepherd.
- **4. Pray for your next Pastor's family.** Whenever we call our next pastor, there's a good chance he won't join our church alone. If he's married, he'll be accompanied by his wife and any children still living at home. And they need your prayers just as much as he does. Pray that that our next pastor's wife and children will adjust to the community and the church and will develop new friendships quickly.

The Ark Encounter opened July 15, 2016 with 7,000 in attendance. In its first three months of operation, over 300,000 people had visited – taking it all in! The ark is the largest timber-frame structure in the world, and most of the wood work was constructed by Old Order Amish men.

Jerry Waldkoetter, owner of The Way to Go Tours, was there twice in its first two years of operation. The timing of the itinerary was enjoyed by his clients. With each of the four visits, the motor coach was either the first or second motor coach to arrive for the day. This gives you a head start for the day!

Add to the itinerary the Creation Museum, the BibleWalk (Mansfield, OH), and the Botanical Gardens (Columbus, OH) and you have quite an inspirational tour!

OISHEI CHILDREN'S COMFORT BAGS

SOMETHING NEW—Jim Wolf, one of our Elders, volunteers with the Family Resource Center at Oishei. Three times each week, volunteers distribute Comfort Bags to all new admits to ensure a warm welcome and reduce an oftentimes stressful scenario. The bags contain necessary toiletries, activities, and treats to provide some measure of comfort while families are away from home. During April, we will be accepting items that are needed to fill these bags. If you wish to support this mission, watch for a list of needed items in the bulletin during April. FEBRUARY MISSION ENVELOPES are designated to support Young Life, an international youth organization with local chapters whose purpose is to bring teens to the knowledge of our loving Savior through meetings, activities, camps, and mentorship from caring, Christian adults. We have several members that have participated in Young Life activities over the years. Dick Crawford has been associated with this organization for many years and would be happy to answer any questions you may have regarding their mission and local work.

MARCH MISSION ENVELOPES will benefit Potter's Field, a volunteer Christian group located in the north end of our city on Highland Avenue. Three times each week, they pick up high risk children and teens whose parents are not active in their lives due to addiction, prostitution or incarceration. They provide a meal, activity, and Bible lessons, and the chance to "just be kids" for a couple of hours. They take them on field trips doing "kid" things they would not otherwise be able to do, such as ice skating and swimming. Their goal is to provide stable adult role models, love, and acceptance while helping them learn about Jesus.

When we asked about the origin of their name, it was explained that historically "potter's fields" were places rich in clay where potters would go to obtain clay that could be molded into beautiful masterpieces of art. Once all of the clay was gone, the field was considered useless and often would become a cemetery for the unwanted and indigent. This group chose their name because they are embracing neglected "throw away kids" and, with God's help, molding them back into the beautiful masterpieces that God created.

YOU COULD SAVE A LIFE

Please mark your calendars for Sunday, February 5. After worship on that Sunday, Pastor Bahr has agreed to hold a short, informal review of how to use our AED (automated external defibrillator). This is the same piece of equipment that saved the life of Damar Hamlin, the Buffalo Bill who collapsed on the field during a game.

The AED is surprisingly easy to use, and yes, **YOU** could do it if needed. Using it does not require medical knowledge or physical strength. More and more public places, such as restaurants and entertainment venues, have AED's available, but they are of no help unless someone who is present is willing to make use of it.

We never know when an emergency will occur. Plan to spend a few minutes in the chapel after church to see how simple it could be to save a life.

Consider joining – please let Erika Tuscher know if you are interested. You can sign up for a month or be "on call" as a substitute or both.


