

UPDATES

THANK YOU for generously donating to our Comfort Bag project for Oishei Children's Hospital. God's timing is always perfect. Jim Wolf, who volunteers at Children's, tells us that our gifts were delivered at a time when their shelves were almost bare. Your gifts will touch the lives of many of our neighbors. The following is part of a letter of thanks received from Oishei:

"On behalf of our 3,000 physicians, nurses, and staff, and the over 150,000 children and moms we serve each year, I want to extend my gratitude for your very generous donation.....Because of the positive impact from donations like yours, Oishei Children's Hospital was named a Top Children's Hospital for the second consecutive year by The Leapfrog Group, a national hospital watchdog organization. This distinction, which recognizes hospital achievements in patient quality and safety, is widely acknowledged as one of the most competitive honors American hospitals can receive."

MISSION ENVELOPE UPDATES:

MARCH MISSION ENVELOPES were designated to support Potter's Field 99. Your donations allowed us to send \$1100 to support the work being done with children in our city that do not have stable parenting influences in their lives.

The following note was received from Rev. & Mrs. Vogel:

"Before we began this ministry, the Lord gave us a passage from Joshua 3. Joshua told the people "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you." Obviously, the Israelites had to have faith to put their feet in the Jordan. The Lord asked us to have faith to love His children, teach His children, train them up in the way they should go. Many people discouraged us because "how could we support a ministry with just children? They don't tithe." God provides. We are so grateful for the faithful people of the Lord like you. I'm not sure how you heard of us, but I know you are part of the Lord's plan. Thank you for listening and walking in faith with us as we answer the great commission. I pray you are able to meet some of the beautiful children you have sown into."

APRIL MISSION ENVELOPES were designated to support Pioneer on the Lake. A donation of \$700 was sent to support the many programs and activities being offered at the camp this summer, along with associated maintenance needs. Pioneer on the Lake offers a peaceful setting on Lake Erie in Angola. Families can enjoy day admissions or rent cottages for a longer stay. In addition to the beach and picnic areas, there are many activities, events, and retreats being offered this summer. If you have never visited, it is worth checking out!

UPCOMING MISSION ENVELOPES:

JUNE MISSION ENVELOPES are designated to support Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) K9 Comfort Dog program. LCC has 130 Golden Retrievers located throughout the US who are trained to interact with people who are suffering and in need. These special dogs open doors and create opportunities to share the mercy, compassion, and presence of Jesus during times of natural or man-made disasters. Since 2008, they have been responding to areas affected by floods, tornadoes, hurricanes and fires. They have also been present after many of the mass shootings experienced in our nation to comfort all those affected, including victims, first responders, and community members. LCC never charges those they serve. This mission is supported by donations, and per LCC policy 100% OF YOUR DONATION will go directly to the training, care, and travel expenses of their K-9's. JULY MISSION ENVELOPES are designated for Wings Flights of Hope. Wings is a local non-profit that flies patients in need of free transportation to specialized medical facilities throughout the northeast. Many times these patients require medical equipment that would not be allowed on a commercial flight. The pilots volunteer their time and planes, and they are on call 24/7 for situations such as organ transplants that require immediate transportation.

AUGUST MISSION ENVELOPES will support LCMS Disaster Response. As you are probably aware, there has been an increase in natural disasters throughout the United States, including many floods, hurricanes, forest fires, and destructive tornadoes. In May during one 48 hour time frame, there were over 50 destructive tornadoes recorded in our Midwestern states. LCMS continuously trains new LERT teams (Lutheran Emergency Response Teams) throughout the country, and they respond to the many areas needing assistance. They help with clearing debris, repairing damaged structures, providing food and other necessities, and they share the love of Jesus with those affected by these tragedies. Because the LERT teams are located throughout the country, they are often able to have "boots on the ground" within 24 hours of the event.

MISSION PROJECTS

SUMMIT LIFE OUTREACH CENTER: Our collection of new baby clothes, infant toiletries, and diapers will continue until Father's Day (June 18). Tables for your donations are located in the chapel and narthex. Summit is a Christian organization in Niagara Falls that assists young women who find themselves in unplanned pregnancy situations. They offer free counseling and pregnancy/child care related education. Clients receive credits each time they attend a session, and the credits can be used in their "Parenting Shoppe" to choose free items needed for baby care. Your gifts will help to "Stock the Shoppe".

BABY BOTTLE BANKS: Banks in the shape of baby bottles are also available on our donation table. If you wish to support Summit in this way, take a bottle home with you and fill it with your spare change. (Checks made out to Summit are also accepted.) Bottles should be returned to the table, the church office, or to Alice Moll on or before Father's Day.

school & craft supplies: During July and August, our donation tables will be set up to receive donations of school and craft supplies. In September, school supplies will be delivered to Harry Abate Elementary and craft supplies will go to Potter's Field 99. Many of the students at Harry Abate are living below the poverty level, and their teachers are very appreciative each year of our donations that help them provide the tools their students need to succeed. Potter's Field is a Christian group in our city that gathers children whose parents are not able or willing to provide stable role models for various reasons. They provide a meal, do crafts, play games, teach Bible stories, and provide the love missing in many of their lives. Examples of needed items for these agencies include crayons, markers, pencils, pens, erasers, glue, scissors, folders, notebook paper, construction paper, glitter, stickers, and colored pencils. Snack packs and juice boxes are also appreciated.

GLASSES & HEARING AIDS: There is a collection box available in the coatroom near the parking lot entrance for your old eyeglasses and hearing aids. We forward these items to the Lion's Club. They are distributed without charge to patients in the United States and throughout the world that cannot afford to purchase them, and who would not be able to see or hear without your help.

HELPFUL FREE SERVICES TO BE AWARE OF

C.A.R.E. (Call And Reassure Elders) is available throughout Niagara County and is designed for individuals who live alone, or homebound couples. A call is made by a volunteer at a prearranged time each week day (or as desired) to verify the recipient's well-being, and a short, friendly conversation usually follows. If the recipient does not answer the phone, a second call is made after waiting 15 minutes. If there is still no answer, a call is made to the recipient's emergency contact. If that fails, 911 is contacted to respond for a welfare check. You can register for free for this program by calling Nancy Smith at the Dale Association, 716-433-1886, Ext. 108. If you are interested in making these calls, you can volunteer by calling the same number.

RESPOND WITH CARE decals are available by calling the Niagara County Sheriff's community services at 716-438-3310. The decals can be placed on a car window or house entrance, and they alert first responders that the individuals inside may have limited communication abilities. They are ideal for families with a member who is visually or hearing impaired, or has a cognitive challenge such as autism, Alzheimer's, or Down Syndrome. There is also the option, if desired, of leaving disability information and emergency contacts with the Sheriff's Department by calling 716-438-3393.
